

ORDINANCE NO. 03-2016-604

AN ORDINANCE BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SALISBURY, LEHIGH COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING SECTION 214 OF CHAPTER 15, PART 2 "TRAFFIC REGULATIONS" OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO REQUIRE STOP SIGNAGE AT CERTAIN INTERSECTIONS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP AND PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, after careful consideration and review, the Board of Commissioners finds that it is in the best interests of the Township community to require stop signs at certain intersections within Salisbury Township.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Salisbury, Lehigh County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the same that Section 214 of Chapter 15, Part 2 of the Code of Ordinances, shall be amended as follows, to wit:

ARTICLE I. Section 214.1 of Chapter 15, Part 2 of the Code of Ordinances shall be amended to include the street intersections listed below and stop signs shall be installed at each intersection accordingly.

Sherwood Circle	Sherwood Road	East
Yorkshire Circle	Yorkshire Road	East
Bishop Road	Yorkshire Road	East
Little John Lane	Greenwood Road	South
Mocking Bird Court	Andrea Drive	West
Sweetbriar Court	Bridle Path Road	West
Hampton Court	Hawthorne Road	East
Louise Court	Louise Lane	West
Olivia Circle	Belford Road	North
Coventry Circle	Hampstead Road	South
Cardinal Drive	Public Road (2)	East & West

ARTICLE II. Section 214.2 of Chapter 15, Part of the Code of Ordinances shall be amended to read as follows:

2. Any person who violates any provision of this §214 shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine ~~of \$25.00~~ and costs as established in the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code [Section 3323 (b) Title 75 Pa. C.S.]

ARTICLE III. ENACTMENT

This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon adoption by the Board of Commissioners. If any sentence, clause, section, or part of this Ordinance is, for any reason, found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid; such unconstitutionality, illegality or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections or parts of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared as the intent of the Board of Commissioners that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence, clause, section or part thereof not been included herein.
